

You can place newspapers, catalogs, magazines, mail and office paper in the bin to be recycled. You can also place shredded paper inside—just leave the shredded paper in bags and place the bags directly in the bin.

The bin will be placed directly behind Plain City Druggist in the back corner closest to the car wash. Plain City Druggist is located at 480 South Jefferson

Avenue in Plain City. You can pull into the parking lot and drop off paper at any time. Just no trash or cardboard, please.

The more paper that is recycled, the more money we will receive to help us spay and neuter more area kitties. This program is good for not only the environment, but it also helps us in our efforts to reduce the number of unwanted cats and kittens.
